


In Loving Memory

Ian Thomas Gould Taylor 1931 - 2021



Peacefully at Providence Care Hospital on Friday, December 3, 2021, our beloved Ian Taylor passed from this life into the glory of his Lord and Savior's presence.

Ian is survived by his daughters: Kita Taylor-Hawkins (Chris) and Margot Taylor. His former wife Zena Taylor; his brother - Roger Cyril Taylor (England); his grandchildren - Steven Green (Laura), Ketsia Snider (Peter), Jeffrey Green (Melissa), Peter Pritchard Rhoda), Roy Kennedy (Kristy) and his great grandchildren: Keely Green, Dawson Green, Flynn Green, Micha Green, Emmett Pritchard, Coulton Pritchard, Lily Kennedy; as well as his relatives in B.C. and in England.

Ian was born in Slough, England. He graduated from the University of London, UK in metallurgical engineering. He immigrated to Canada in 1955 and worked at Alcan as a research engineer for over 20 years. During this time he created two patents for aluminum alloys, one for military armor plate and the other for making heat-exchangers. He gave his heart and life to the Lord in 1974, moved to Toronto and became a founding member of 100 Huntley Street. After that he created his own publishing company and spent 3 years researching and writing "*In The Minds of Men*", a book exposing the theory of evolution. This took Ian on speaking engagements in almost every State of the US and provinces of Canada, then to Russia, Ukraine, Moldova, China, Hong Kong, Bangkok and Singapore.

Ian went on to become a board member of Creation Moments and for over 25 years was "the voice" of the *Today's Creation Moments* daily radio program and the narrator of *Moments with God's Creation* DVD series. The *Today's Creation Moments* radio broadcast is currently distributed to over 1,300 radio stations and outlets in the US, and over a dozen in Canada UK and many countries internationally.

Ian loved his family and he loved animals. He had a subtle sense of humour, and he could fix anything usually better than it was originally built. He was a true perfectionist. But most of all Ian loved the Lord and devoted his life to living for Him and to bringing others to the Lord. He truly was a "good and faithful servant".

We wish to thank all of the amazing staff at Providence Care for the genuine loving care he received while he was there. He truly never would have received better care anywhere else.
