

“So what does the Bible say about how to be saved?”

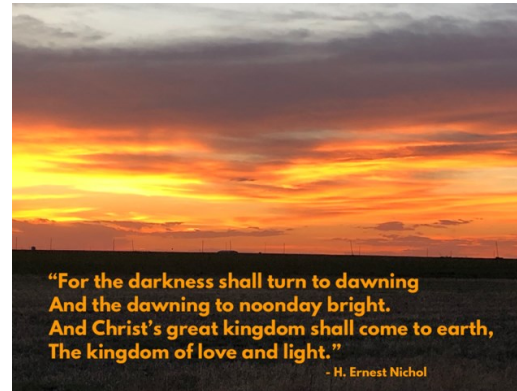
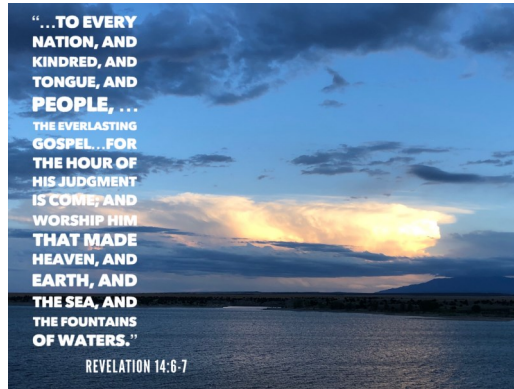

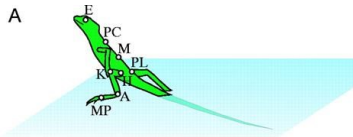
MEET THE JESUS CHRIST LIZARD!



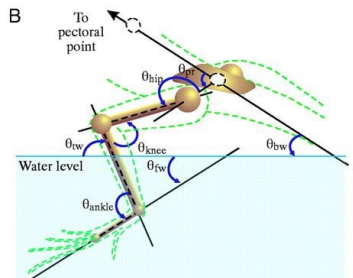
**A little

In the river-laced jungles of Central America an agile reptile *B. Basiliscus* demonstrates why it has earned the nickname, “The Jesus Christ Lizard”. It runs on water. Upright on two legs the lizard can skip briskly across the surface of a river.

Apparently most of its ability comes from a well-timed downward stroke of the foot, slapping the water and creating an air filled cavity while quickly moving on to the next step. Of course physical parameters such as the animal’s weight, the length of its leg, and the shape of its foot, also factor into this ability.



The Jesus Christ Lizard testifies to at least two things:



1) God can use the testimony of His “general revelation” (His creation) to remind us of His “special

revelation” (Jesus Christ) 2) If God created the present physics of our creation, He can change the physics of a local environment in order to perform miracles!

That’s why Jesus did many miracles—He was and is the Son of God! A miracle is by definition a miracle if it falls outside the probability of occurrence defined by the physics of creation. Nature within the physics of this present creation, is constrained by three dimensions of space and one dimension of time –and by the present values for the natural constants of physics (e.g. the gravitational constant, the densities and other properties of materials, etc.). Miracles would cease to be miracles if the physics were changed. If we somehow got beyond our four dimensional existence,

the present constants of physics, and the laws of probability, we might be able to explain what otherwise must be called a miracle.

If the density of water immediately below the footsteps of Jesus Christ increased instantly and sufficiently to bear His weight...

...but hold on, who is Jesus again?!

Would you like to have a personal relationship with the God who designed you and became a human being like you? And demonstrated his divinity in many ways including rising from the dead — that you might join him in incorruptible immortality? Here’s what you need to know, based on words from the Creator’s own book, the Bible:

God’s original design for mankind was disrupted by sin.

For all have sinned [disobeyed God], and come short of the glory [beautiful perfection] of God. (Romans 3:23)

For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. (Romans 6:23)

But God commends his love toward us in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. (Romans 5:8)

“Okay, so I’m a sinner. How can Jesus help me?”

For Christ also suffered once for sins, the just for the unjust, that He might bring us to God, indeed being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the Spirit. (1 Peter 3:18)

“But isn’t Jesus just one of many ways I can be saved?”

And there is salvation in no other One; for there is no other name under Heaven given among men by which we must be saved. (Acts 4:12) Jesus said to him, I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life; no one comes to the Father, but by me. (John 14:6)

“Can’t I get to heaven by obeying God’s commandments as best as I can?”

Therefore by the deeds of the Law none of all flesh will be justified in His sight: for through the Law is the knowledge of sin. (Romans 3:20)
