“So what does the Bible say about how to be saved?”

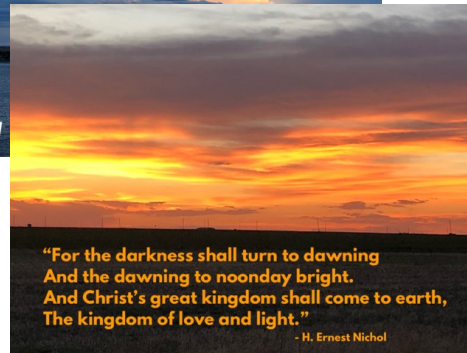
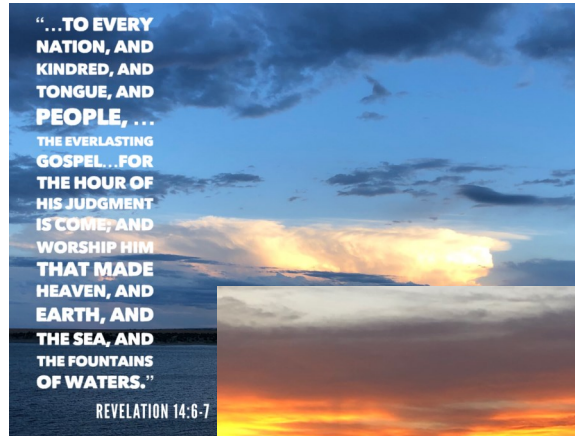

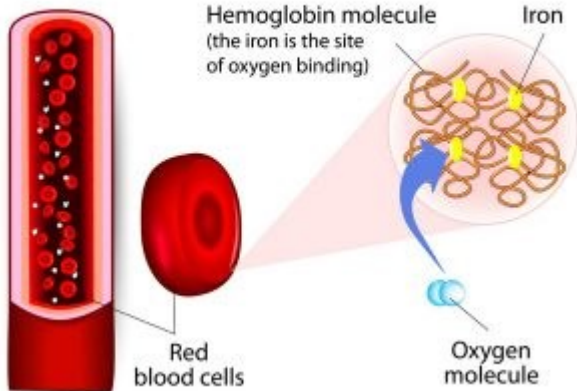
Donate blood! Save lives! Paramedics and emergency rooms know that blood



transfusions are critical tools for saving lives. Without enough blood we would all die within minutes!

Today we understand how each molecule of hemoglobin in the blood, with an iron atom at the center of each of 4 quadrants is specifically shaped and constituted to “grab hold of” and transport up to eight atoms of oxygen. “Red blood cells”, each loaded with 250,000 or more of these hemoglobin molecules carry the life-giving oxygen from the lungs through arteries and capillaries to all the far flung cells of the body. And they carry back to the lungs the exhaust product carbon dioxide, exchanged for the oxygen.

HEMOGLOBIN

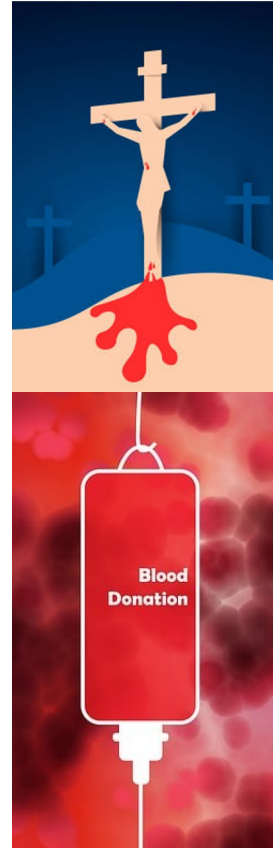


And then there are the “white blood cells” which learn to recognize and kill viruses and other germ-infected cells. They are part of the tremendous warfare continually taking place on a bio-molecular level in our bodies. The blood-borne armies of our immune system are constantly fighting the bacterial, viral, and toxic invaders of our physiology. If it wasn't for the

blood's immune system we would all be, as they say, “dead meat”. **Truly, “the life of the flesh is in the blood” (Lev 17:11)** - confirming, as happens again and again, that Biblical truth is not just “skin deep”.

The Biblical World-view maintains a connection between the spread of infection and the spread of sin. This is a powerful analogy, and the design of a Holy God who created our life-support system in the first place.

To be holy is by definition to be free from sin, just as to be clean is by definition to be free from dirt and germs. We can't seem to eradicate infectious disease. Bacteria, viruses, and disease are all around. We are totally dependent on the immune system carried throughout our bodies by our blood. Similarly, we can't eradicate the sin which infests this world, our flesh, and our spiritual adversary, the devil. The solution to our dilemma once again is a blood-borne immunity—



By Definition: If God Created the Universe and all it contains, then He must perfectly understand it all, and have perfect power over it. this time found in the blood of Jesus Christ, the unmerited gift of God to us!
