

Blood:

Another Masterpiece of Design!




It's no accident that red blood cells are shaped this way. Keep on reading to find out why God designed them like this!

Have you ever wondered why blood cells look like red discs that are indented toward the middle? Furthermore, is this distinctive shape an element of design or is it the product of millions of years of mutations and natural selection?



Scientists have used computers to determine the ideal shape for a cell whose job is transporting oxygen from the lungs to other cells in the body and taking away carbon dioxide. They discovered that the bio-concave shape allows for maximum surface contact of oxygen-carrying hemoglobin within the red blood cells for transfer to neighboring cells.



The peculiar shape also gives red blood cells flexibility and elasticity, so they can be folded when flowing through narrow blood capillaries!

Plus, the smooth, rounded edges greatly reduce the amount of friction, so they don't tear the walls of the veins, arteries and capillaries as they scurry through.

Evolution would say that these designs were perfected through intermediate steps. But can you imagine the internal bleeding and blood clotting of such organisms from their very beginning? There is no evolutionary mechanism to get to the ideal design for red blood cells because the organisms would die long before they could reproduce!

Blood cells had to be designed just right the first time. It's like that with all the parts of the body, actually. There is no way to get from A to Z, because B through Y in the evolutionary process would be "killers". So, you essentially have to believe that a frog can turn into a prince!



And while we're on the subject, ask yourself which evolved first – the blood, the heart, or the circulatory system with its 60,000 miles of veins, arteries and capillaries? Once again, God had to have created them all at the same time!

Wouldn't you like to have a personal relationship with the God who designed you and invites you to become part of His family?
